



132 His Grace Archbishop Benedict Mar Gregorios

Archbishop Benedict Mar Gregorios was the Second Metropolitan Archbishop of the Svro-MalankaraCatholicChurch.Hewasborn on 1st February 1916 at Kallooppara, Kerala. Heassumed then a me Benedict. which means blessed, and on 15 August 1935 he took his temporary religious vows (profession) before Archbishop Mar Ivanios. He was appointed the first Principal of Mar Ivanios College. In 1952, he was elected as Bishop. He was ordained as Rembanin the Archbishop's HouseChapelon27December1952andmade Auxiliary Bishop of the Archieparchy of Trivandrum after the name Mar Gregorios. He became the Archbishop in January 1955. He received pallium, on 14th May 1959.
