





Founder Late. His Grace Archbishop Benedict Mar Gregorios (1962-1994)

Archbishop Benedict Mar Gregorios was the Second Metropolitan Archbishop of the Syro-Malankara Catholic Church. He was born on 1st February 1916 at Kallooppara, Kerala. He assumed the name Benedict, which means blessed, and on 15th August 1935 he took his temporary religious vows before Archbishop Mar Ivanios. He was appointed as the first Principal of Mar Ivanios College. He was elected as Bishop in 1952. He was ordained as Remban in the Archbishop's House Chapel on 27th December 1952 and was made as Auxiliary Bishop of the Archieparchy of Trivandrum after the name Mar Gregorios. He became the Archbishop in January 1955. He received pallium, on 14th May 1959. He dedicated his priestly life to the service for the human society through his ministry.

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



Following the reunion movement of 1930, Archbishop Mar Ivanios established educational institutions in both rural and urban areas, in line with Jesus Christ's command to preach to all nations. The Malankara Syrian Catholic Trust in Chennai began its educational service in 1974 with the modest beginnings of Sacred Heart School in Padi, Chennai. This institution provided matriculation and higher secondary education.

With the intention of expanding their educational services, there were initial plans to establish an engineering college in Greater Chennai. The land for this college was allotted by the Metropolitan and Municipal Development Authority (MMDA) through Housing Board, and it was secured through a sealed tender process. Ms. Narmada, the then councillor of Mogappair locality in the Greater Chennai Corporation, played a crucial role in obtaining approval for the land. The building plans were subsequently approved by Mr. P.S. Pandiyan, I.A.S., who served as the Member Secretary of MMDA.

On July 5, 1994, Mar Gregorios College was founded by Archbishop Benedict Mar Gregorios of Tiruvananthapuram, Kerala. The primary motive of the founder was to provide quality education at an affordable fee in an area surrounded by laborers from the Ambattur Industrial Estate, which is an industrial hub in Chennai. Due to financial constraints, the college initially started with a Diploma Course in computer software and hardware, with Dr. J.C. Kuriakose from IIT Madras appointed as the principal. The efforts of the college resulted in training students who excelled, pursued M.Tech. degrees, and secured employment in multinational companies.

In response to public demand, Mar Gregorios College was established as an arts and science college affiliated to the University of Madras in 1997 had a humble beginning with six staff members and 170 students, offering programs in B.Com. General, B.A. Economics, B.Sc. Electronic Science & Communication, and B.Sc. Mathematics. Fr. K.C. George S.J. became the first principal of MGC, with Fr. George Charuvilla serving as the Secretary. His Excellency Most Rev. Dr. Joshua Mar Ignathios, the co-founder of MGC, was then the Vicar General of the Trivandrum Archdiocese. His Beatitude, Moran Mor Cyril Baselios Catholicos OIC, was the esteemed Catholicos and Head of the Malankara Syrian Catholic Church at that time.

Rev. Fr. K.C. George S.J., the first principal and director, played a vital role in the academic and infrastructural development of the college. Under the able guidance and support of the Secretary, Rev. Fr. George Charuvilla, new programs in B.Com.Corporate Secretaryship and B.C.A. (Computer Applications) were introduced in the year 2000. He also implemented an effective system for administration and academics.

Having in mind the welfare of the Staff, He established Staff Welfare Association in 2000. He initiated to join hands with Loyola College to enrol our students in N.C.C. in 2000. N.S.S was established in 1999. To cater the needs of the slow learners, Remedial class was introduced after class hours. Vineetha George of B.A. Economics became the first student in the history of MGC to secure 5th Rank at the University of Madras in 2000.

First post-graduation program M.S.W. (Social Work) was incepted in 2002 by Fr.K.C.George S.J. during the time of Rev.Fr. Jose Chamakalayil, Secretary. In 2003, post-graduation program M.Sc. Electronics & Communication and in 2005 B.Sc.Visual Communication was incepted. Arockiya Benjamin of B.Sc.CSc. was the first Cadet from MGC to be selected to participate in the National Republic Day Parade held at New Delhi in 2003. The Mother Mary Grotto was laid amidst the architecture fountain sponsored by Dr. V.J. Mathew, Principal.

In 2009, Rev. Fr. Johnson Parrackel, the Secretary of MGC, established Shift-II, which marked another significant milestone in the pursuit of academic excellence. This expansion introduced four new programs: B.C.A., B.B.A., B.Com. General, and B.Com.C.S. The Secretary's commendable achievements include transforming the grounds into cricket and athletic field, establishing a cricket pitch, constructing the second and third floors, and initiating the NAAC process to elevate the standards of MGC. Rev. Fr. K.C. George SJ Cricket Tournament, an intercollegiate T20 series, was inaugurated to honour the former first principal.

MGC underwent a significant expansion in 2018 with the construction and completion of a new building, providing approximately 60,000 square feet of additional space. This achievement was made possible through the dedicated efforts of Fr. Sabu M George, the Secretary. During the years 2014 to 2017, the college introduced six new undergraduate programs (B.A. English, B.A. Tamil, B.B.A., B.Com.A&F, B.Sc.CSc., B.Com.C.A.) and two new postgraduate programs (M.Com.General, M.Sc.CSc.) in Shift-I and Shift-II respectively. As a result, the student body grew significantly, reaching a total of 2,617 students across both shifts.

Under the guidance of the Secretary, various initiatives were undertaken to improve the college's overall quality and attain a grading from NAAC. These efforts included the establishment of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The college's main entrance underwent modifications, featuring an impressive architectural front elevation. Noteworthy additions within the campus included the construction of the Mother Mary Grotto and the Gregorios Chapel which was dedicated by the Manager, His Excellency Thomas Mar Anthonios in the year 2016.



To enhance the facilities, staff rooms were equipped with internet access, and several amenities were installed, such as RO water purifiers, solar power panels, a biometric system for staff entry/exit, complete CCTV surveillance, sanitary vending machines in girls' washrooms, and a fully Wi-Fi enabled campus. In addition, the Principal's Office, Accounts Office, and Secretary's Office were furnished with new facilities.

To accommodate the growing number of students, the computer lab was extended to accommodate 77 students with 77 computers. An open arena theatre was also constructed. The college experienced a remarkable 2.5-fold increase in student enrolment. Academic achievements were also notable, with six first-rank holders and 274 students ranking in the top hundred at the university level. The college maintained a consistent placement record, with 100 to 150 students placed annually.

The teaching staff saw a substantial increase from 65 to 95 members, with a 25% increase in staff eligibility qualifications (NET/SET/Ph.D.). The college celebrated numerous achievements in extracurricular activities as well, including NCC students participating in the Delhi Republic Day Parade and receiving gold medals in various competitions such as firing and powerlifting.

In honor of the Birth Centenary of the late Archbishop Benedict Mar Gregorios, the beloved founder of the college, numerous charitable activities were organized at MGC. These initiatives included the establishment of MARG SWEF (Mar Gregorios Student Welfare Fund), a relief fund dedicated to providing medical aid to students in need. Financial support was also extended to a senior citizen affected by floods in December 2015 through the "Home for a Homeless" program. Furthermore, a flood relief fund was set up, where staff and students collaborated to provide grocery items to those affected and in need. The college also organized a free medical camp for both staff and students, offering valuable healthcare services. As a gesture of gratitude, funds were raised by staff and students for the victims of the Kargil War in 1999. Additionally, a free eye camp was conducted in collaboration with Shankara Netralaya at the college premises, benefiting nearly 200 individuals from the local community through diagnosis and treatment. Rev. Fr. Sabu M George, Secretary introduced the "Five Loaves Program," aimed to feed the hunger, which was inaugurated by the Vicar General and Correspondent, Rev. Msgr. Varghese Mattamana. Another grand event, the Pongal Carnival, was organized to raise funds for church construction, adding a festive touch to the occasion. To commemorate this remarkable celebration in the history of MGC, a National Conference on the Life and Legacy of Late Arch Bishop Benedict Mar Gregorios was organized. During the event, the College Anthem, written by Ms. S. Ann Hepzibah Niraja, Dean of Academic Innovations, was released by the brother of our Founder, His Grace Benedict Mar Gregorios.



MGC Prayer Cell was established with the aim of nurturing the spiritual growth of students and fostering a sense of collective prayer within the MGC Family. Various other clubs and cells were created to identify and develop the potential of students in non-academic activities. These include the Entrepreneur Cell, Techie Club, Consumer Club, Women's Cell, I.A.S. Academy, Students Resource Team, Career Guidance Cell, Social Excellence, Red Ribbon Club, and Youth Red Cross. These clubs and cells provide platforms for students to explore their talents, interests, and skills outside of the academic realm.

Fr. Philip Pulipra's role as the Secretary was exceptional and exquisite in all aspects. The college experienced extensive infrastructural development, which helped to create a conducive learning environment for students. Fr. Philip Pulipra's emphasis on academic excellence resulted in MGC's recognition on a global scale. The college's academic programs, teaching methodologies, and research initiatives gained prominence and attracted attention from the international academic community. These include the establishment of an N.C.C. Sub Unit (Army Wing), the adoption of Perungavur village, provision of free health insurance for all staff and students, the Gregorios Scholarship for deserving students, first ever students cultural and technical groups namely Gregorian Dazzlers, Gregorian Sizzlers and Gregorian Cameotechies, MGC Bus, the creation of a Medicinal Garden-El Paraiso, Sanctuary Garden named Vrindavan, Language Lab, Digital Library, the inclusion of an Edit Suite and Preview Theatre, the setup of a Drawing, Dubbing & Photography Studio, a Language Laboratory, Obstacles for NCC Cadets, a Multipurpose Playground, Cricket pitch, badminton court, Basket Ball Court, and the creation of a pathway for walking.

MGC actively became a member of the Xavier Board and AIACHE which allowed the college to engage and collaborate with other minority higher educational institutions. MGC registered with the ICT Academy, enabling the students and staff to access resources and opportunities related to information and communication technology. MGC joined as a member in the UGC Institutional Innovation Cell, indicating the college's commitment to fostering innovation and implementing creative ideas within its academic and administrative practices. The establishment of the Creative Club aimed to stimulate students' interest in creative ideas, provide a platform for their expression, and showcase their talents. Similarly, the Eco Green Club was formed to create awareness about the environment and educate students on its significance. To address emotional and psychological issues and promote well-being, MGC set up a Counselling Cell. Trained counsellors offered support and guidance to both students and staff, facilitating their overall mental health.



MGC placed emphasis on holistic growth through various initiatives such as Add-on courses, Skill Development programs, Hands-on Training programs, outreach programs, seminars, webinars, and workshops. These activities were designed to enhance students' overall skill set and broaden their knowledge base. To foster collaboration and provide practical exposure, MGC signed Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) with reputed companies and institutions. This led to the organization of the first-ever Staff and Student Exchange Program in collaboration with Bishop Appasamy College of Arts & Science for an Online Certificate Course on Photography and Contemporary Arts. This success opened doors for other departments to establish similar partnerships for Staff-Student Exchange Programs.

In 2022, MGC celebrated its silver jubilee under the theme "MGC THANKS CHENNAI," initiated by the Secretary Fr.Philip Pulipra expressing gratitude towards the city. The celebration featured a symbolic logo representing the theme "SNEHAM MAMADEEPAM," meaning "LOVE IS MY LIGHT." The jubilee events encompassed five domains: Education, Spirituality, Social, Arts & Culture, and Sports, showcasing the college's twenty-five-year journey through unique programs and activities. The grand celebration witnessed the esteemed presence of notable individuals including His Beatitude Moran Mor Baselios Cardinal Cleemis Catholicos, Archbishop of Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala, Dr. K. Ponmudy, Honourable State Minister for Higher Education, Co-founder His Excellency Most Rev. Dr. Joshua Mar Ignathios, Bishop of Mavelikara, Kerala, and Manager His Excellency Most Rev. Dr. Thomas Mar Anthonios, Bishop of Gurgaon, New Delhi & Episcopal Administrator, Khadki, Pune. Additionally, Member of the Legislative Assembly, Mr. Karambakkam Ganapathy, Trust Members Mr. P.A. Joykutty and Mr. V.T. Mathew, Secretary Rev. Fr. Philip Pulipra, Principal Dr. M. Sivarajan, Vice Principals Dr. G. Gayathri and Dr. S. Shalini Mehar, and other esteemed guests, sponsors, parents, students, and staff were present. Staff completing twenty-five years of service in MGC, former principals, retired Non-teaching Staff were honoured on this momentous occasion.

Scholarships for children from humble background, educational assistance to 25 students, ecumenical fellowship, financial aid for kidney dialysis patients, Midday meal for the poor and needy, adaptation of Perungavur village were the few notable events. MGC Divyadeep Award and Good Samaritan Award was given to Mr.Paranthaman, a differently-abled Artist and My.Nandhakumar IRS for his selfless service to the society. The grand finale concluded with a cultural extravaganza by MGCians. Students, parents, well-wishers, alma mater were present for the celebration.




MGC University TOP Rank Holders, 1997-2022



Computer Applications Shift-I

Furthermore, special provisions are made for visually challenged students, including e-braille reading facilities. The department actively organizes various activities and events to engage students and enhance their learning experience. One notable event is the three-day Book Exhibition held during the National Library Week. This exhibition is inaugurated by Fr. Rev. Philip Pulipra, Secretary, MGC, and attracts enthusiastic participation from students. Additionally, in collaboration with the Department of Tamil, the department celebrates International Mother Language Day, emphasizing the importance of linguistic diversity and cultural heritage.





Beyond Academics National Service Scheme

NSS Unit of MGC was established on 24th September, 1999. A group of service-minded students, led by Principal Fr. K.C. George SJ and Mr. S. Sargurunathan, organized various activities to inculcate social responsibility in the minds of the students. They also worked on clearing up the college grounds and creating a playground on campus. Every year, the NSS unit organizes Blood Donation camps and Free Medical camps for students, staff, and the general public. Since then, NSS has encouraged student participation in camps.






Beyond Academics

SILVER JUBILEE CELEBRATION


